BOB'S HAB BACK AGAIN—1980 CHAMP

Bob's Hab is once again Variety League champs, the second time during the last four years. With another super year for Capt. Roger Campbell, the Habs were able to hold off a late charge from Tony's Tigers and Gortons winning by three points. Roger's 119 average plus five 400 triples were a contributing factor during the first round and a good team effort down the stretch won the title.

Going into the last week of regular competition, three teams were lining up for a possible three-way tie and the prospect of a rolloff. Bob's took care of that by winning all eight points from Tony's Tigers who had to settle for second spot. Gortons dropped to third by losing six points to the Building Center who finished in fourth.

If you study the stat sheets you'll see one item that made the difference during the year. All five regulars on the Habs improved over last year's averages, including the captain. Kevin Lowe upped his three points to a 107 as Jake Ahonen moved up two points to a 105. Peter Clifford added five average points to 105 and Roger rose three. President Harry Powers had a banner year with a steady season that saw him add three points finishing with an even 100. Steve Sharac was unable to bowl due to illness and was replaced by tyro Steve Howard. Unfamiliar to the small balls after rolling ten pins for years, Steve finished the final week with a huge 382 and a fine 99 average.

The next-to-last week saw the Habs hit a 1723 triple and high single of 617 as they reared in the crown. In the finals they outdueled Tony's 1705 to 1600.

Tony's earned second by coming on fast the third round after a slow start. Walt Church, Dave Harrison, Bill Wakeling and Tony all scored 100-plus with Joe Francis (99) and George Pierce (92) chipping in some good weeks. The last three weeks done them in as they gained only 4 of a possible 24 points.

Gorton's were also a contender led by Joe B's 112 season, his best ever. Jaureguy (103), Heinonen (110), Unis (101) and Tim Davis at 99 tried but dripped six during the crucial final week. Broad rolled only 46 strings finishing at 95.

Despite Riley's heroics, the Building Center only finished ninth overall, setting records along the way. Billy Marshall upped his average to 103, with Joe Fiers standing at 102. Amidst many 400s, team all-time triple of 1826, they still could place no higher than fourth in any round.

In checking the records we noticed, as usual, that Roger had again surrounded

himself with the crafty talents of Harry Powers and Jake Ahonen who both were aboard the 1977 pennant team. Jake proved his worth being under 300 on only five occasions and adding that needed punch the final week.

Another great year for a great team — our 1980 Champs — Bob's Hab.

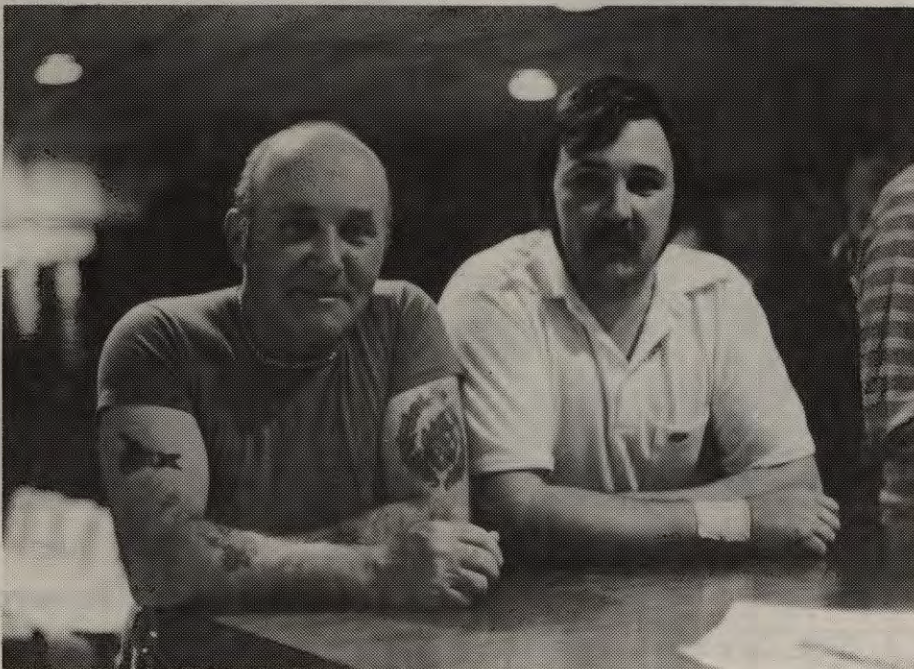

Destino's improved each round from two to twelve points winding up in fifth place for the season. Capt. Lafata had a 174 single—410 triple with assists from Will Gouzie (110) and Oscar Dennis (103). The Co-ops made a few feints at being contenders each round, but faded into oblivion finishing 8th overall. A bit erratic they still had a creditable 1633 team three with Capt. Dick Oliver in 10th spot with a 111. Jack Laurie and Roger Cressey had some big nights while Sears, Lane and Ercolani provided the ballast. Contributions are being accepted to buy Oliver a plain T-shirt next year — one that says absolutely nothing.

The Larsen family reunion, Jack, Al, Chris and Glenn Selig had some bright moments during 1980 finishing second the first round. Selig had a high single of 152 and Ted Tysver and Jack were in the top ten with 107 and 111 respectively. Phil Balazarini closed at 102 with two Waltons, er Larsens, in the 90s.

Mr. Billante was seen marking his school grade sheets on one quiet night at the lanes. Hit 87 the first string but then he finished his report cards and rolled a 146-117/351 for the nite. Such dedication. Average-wise he continues to improve rolling 108-106-109-109-112 the past five years.

Despite his advanced old-age, Dub White posted a 100 average while bowling for the lowly Vets. Not bad considering the handicap—his and the team.

Pearce Sears left the TV set for a short while this year and rolled some 300s, best of which was a good 330.

THIS YEAR'S ROOKIE ALSO WINS HIGH SINGLE AWARD

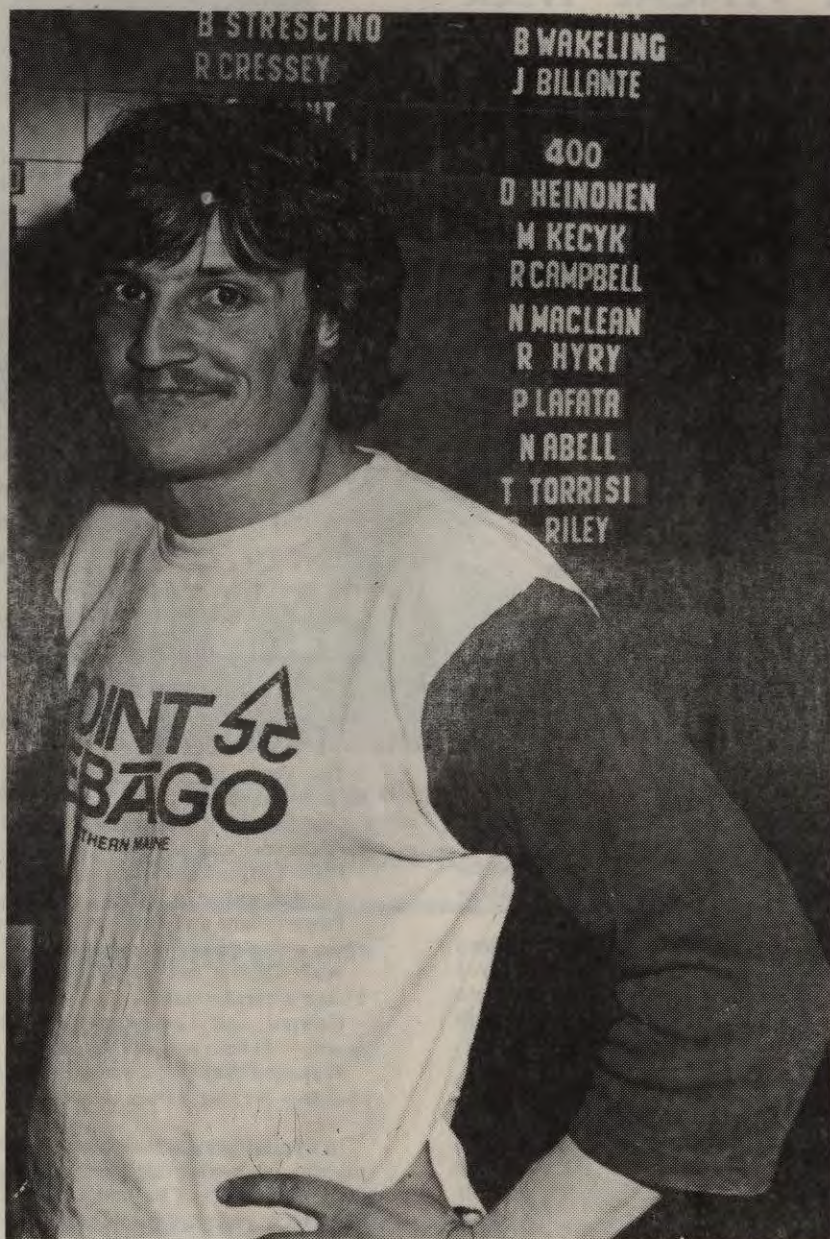
Mike Keczyk is the winner of our Rookie of the Year Award for the '79-80 season by virtue of his solid 114 average. Usually a rookie has an average in the low 100's in winning this event, but Mike has shattered precedent with an outstanding year, his first in the major's. His 114 was high enough to place him 4th overall among the top rollers in this, our 51st season.

A fast-ball roller, Mike really lays 'em down and was instrumental in the fine finish of the Steeler's during the third round. While one of the quieter members of his team, he nonetheless was a welcome addition.

Another highlight of the year for Mike was winning the high single string title rolling a 175. This puts him right up there with the likes of Jim Wentzell, the late Forrest Dare, Ron Pierce, Roger Cressey, Neil MacLean, and of course, Don Riley. Pete Lafata came in a very close second with a 174 — just a pin shy of fame, but still a good single. There were many strings in this range during the year and Mike came out on top as champ along with winning the coveted rookie award — a double winner. **The 175 single also was the impetus for Mike's first 400 in the league, a 406.* Other highs were a 392, 387 and a 386, while bowling 96 of the scheduled 99 strings.

A new Variety League record for team total was set during the past season. Don Rileys Building Center Team hit a total of 1826 to erase the former record total 1813 held by the Steelers since the 1971-1972 season.

Seven teams totaled 1700 or more in 1979-1980 matches.

Three new members joined the 400 Club during the past season. They include Pete Lafata, and Tony Torrissi, Veterans of many Variety League seasons and newcomer, Mike Keczyk.

Thirteen scores of 400 or higher were recorded in the 1979-1980 year.

Sherm's CAVets showed some spark the second round led by Howie Lodges 110 average. Sherm chipped in at 104 but alas, attendance problems forced them to an 11th place finish in the finals.

Last year's champions Deerings became the winners of our "Foundation of the League" award gaining a wee eight points for three rounds. Capt. Neil was steady throughout ably assisted by Frank Lander's 105 effort. Again, attendance was a factor plus a few off nights teamwise. Wait 'till next year, right Sylvester.

Tony Torrissi not only reached the 400 bracket, he placed second with a 425 while outgunning many big names. He finished at eighth high average with 111.83; high single of 150.

Bowlers Dan Heinonen and Fran Clooney each rolled all 99 strings.

Don Riley exploded over a nine week period averaging 131 per string to overtake Roger Campbell and sew up his seventh Variety League title.

We were fortunate in having a fine crop of young bowlers in the league this year, including the already mentioned Mike Keczyk, Jack Foote, Mike Patil, Tom Robinson, Ernie Hall, Steve Howard, Larry Doyle, Chris Larsen, Dave Tarr, and Tony Curcuru.

Jake Ahonen was seen signing up for a language class recently. After listening to Campbell all season he has gone completely stone deaf.

A TYPICAL WEEK AT CAPE ANN?

While looking for material to fill this sheet we came across an interesting score-sheet which could serve as a typical week on the schedule. Overall averages were up a bit, 400 triples were quite common and many of us enjoyed some great weeks due to either pins, luck or the state of the art. Herewith was a sample match between Larsens Shoe and Gleasons.

With all ten combatants on hand this Monday, a total of 90 marks were posted—13 strikes and 77 spares.

As fate would have it, Gleason's won all eight points outlasting Larsens 1727 to 1552. High roller was Fran Clooney with a 366. Charlie Campbell tossed a 359 and Mike Keczyk a 356 to aid the Gleason sweep. Paul Pollizzia had a 317 followed by Steve Bradley 329. Fran had 14 marks, Campbell 10 including a double strike, and Mike and Steve 11 each.

For Larsens, Capt. Jack rolled a 345, Tysver 313 and Selig 309. Jack led his team with 10 big hits while Ted added seven more. Of the 10 combatants, eight were over 300 and the two remaining bowlers a few pins shy.

Just an average day on the lanes for these guys while many of us continue to struggle along. Of course there have been better nights for many teams, but still this match serves as a reminder of the caliber of Variety League teams.

EDITOR'S NOTE: After researching this match with the sheet from the alley, I now find out that this was the same night that Gleason's set league second high team triple. So much for being observant.

Ernie Bishop appears to be one of the most constant, average-wise, rolling 100 - 100 - 101 - 98 for the past four seasons. Almost the same as his golf scores.

Missing from action this year were Neil Marshall, Millard Ring, Rick Melanson, Dave Stowell, Bill Morris and many other fine bowlers. The welcome mat is always out to these gents.

Topples High Team Triple Record

The Building Center team has erased one of the league's all-time records by rolling a 1826 triple during the year. The previous high was set in 1972 by the Steelers as they amassed a total of 1813 logs for three strings.

Led by Capt. Don Riley's 432 (naturally), the pins were really flying as every member of the team was over 300. Jack Foote's 393 was the second big factor in this award-winning performance.

Even as the team was on their way to breaking the eight-year record, there was some doubt if they could also topple team high single. At the final tally they stood at 633, some 44 pins shy of a double sweep and a chance to break Park's Electric 17-season hold on team single. An 1826 is outstanding, while trying to surpass the 677 plateau was just not meant to be. The Park's record contained Wentzell's 200 single, not easily duplicated.

Many records were threatened during the '80 season and the Building Center team proved to be the team to establish a new one for all to shoot for in the coming years. Records were meant to be broken and they did just that. Congrats to a fine team for this is truly a team effort.

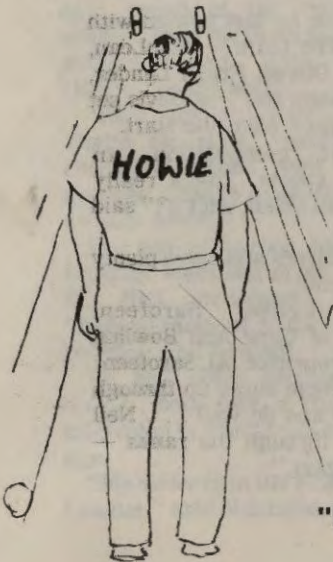
