DEERINGS SPARKLE AS 1979 CHAMPS

In another close race, Deering Electric captured the Variety League title by five points in our 50th championship season. Destino's and Crossett's finished in a tie for second place as Tony's Tigers were just a step away in third.

Much can be said for the various formats and schedules for leagues, but it appears that since we began the three round series a few seasons back, the competition has improved and the finishes are just short of sensational. I think most will agree that interest has increased and attendance has risen due to this single factor.

Sylvester Deering engineered a bowling coup as he signed on a tall, bespeckled lad by the name of Neil MacLean as his '78-'79 captain. Not only did MacLean bowl well, he nearly walked away with several league titles. His 116 average gave him third high average as he continually scored in the high 300's, falling below that mark just one night. Seeing this, the old redhead cranked up the arm the third week for a big 371 and a 101 year.

Deering's took both the first and second rounds and as has happened before, faltered a bit to finish fourth in the final series. It wasn't until the last night when the title was firmly secure and the Sparkies won the coveted crown.

Surprise lead-off man was Frank Lander — 105; followed by Dick Oliver with a good 113. Tim Davis pulled up lame and even though the team bowled short-handed on many occasions, a good team effort pulled them through. Ernie Bishop tossed in his 101 while

Alley Echos

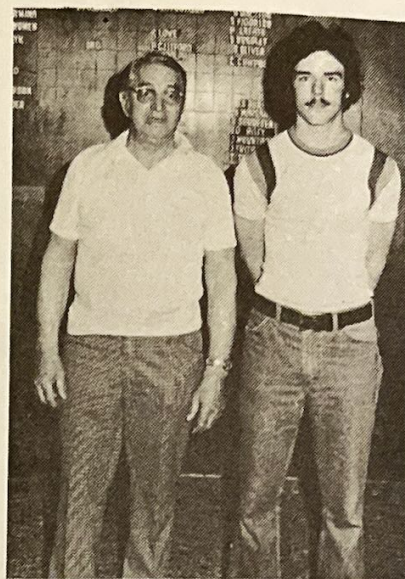

Robbie's appeared to be a sure winner, but the tenth frame was a disaster, and he settled for third.

Kevin Lowe continues to impress as he rolled a fine 104 this year. His 103 last season indicates he's ready to make a move on the leaders.

Campbell regains high average leadership

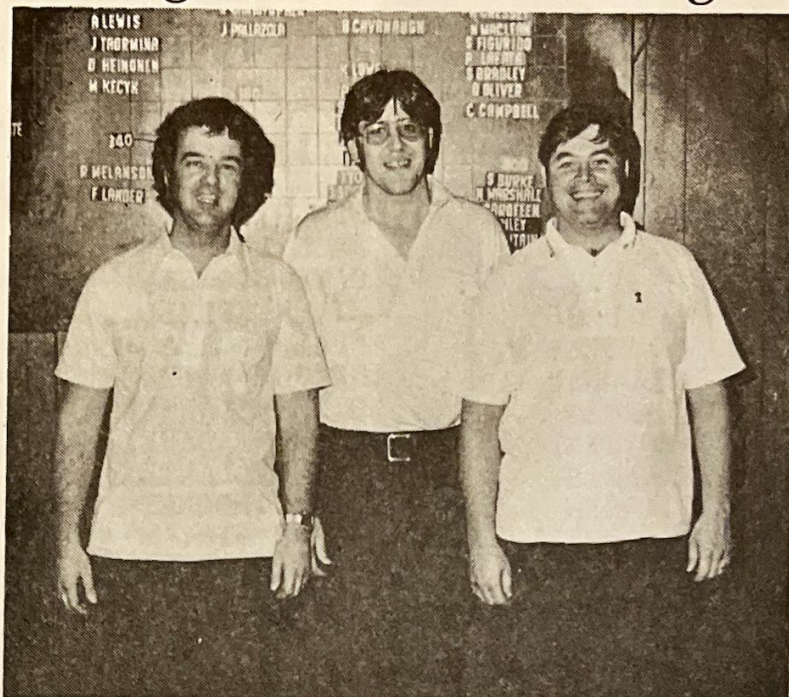
In one of the most dramatic clutch matches of the year, Roger Campbell is once more on top of the pile as our high average winner. It's been seven long years for Campbell as he's regained his past form.

Neil MacLean led the league for 16 weeks preceding D-Day after taking over for Don Riley who was the leader for the 11 weeks prior to that. Going into the last night of the season, Campbell was 40 pins behind MacLean and 35 in back of second place Riley. Roger began slowly with a 121 as he set his sights on the top slot. His second was a resounding 149 and both Neil and Don knew they were in for trouble. He started the final string with a smashing five box and lay at 31 for the first five boxes. It appeared the portly one was fading and then, wham — strike, strike, spare and a fine 136 finish for a 406 series. His first 400 of the season really put the pressure on his opponents, who tried vainly to catch up. MacLean posted 329 and dropped to third as Riley moved to second. In the final frame, Don was faced with a very difficult and much-needed spare to outlast Campbell. It was not meant to be as he missed the shot and relinquished the top spot in one of the most topsy-turvy strings witnessed at the Bowling Center. Final results gave Campbell the number one position at 116.49; Don Riley second at 116.43; and Neil MacLean third with a 116.12.

The story around the lanes is that the newly-married champ has never been so stoic and that with more practice he could once again become the terror of the league.

For the record book, this was Roger's eighth crown dating back to his years as a youth in 1962. He has also been runner-up seven times, mainly to Riley and

Both had exceptional years as relative newcomers and both finished in the money in the over-average match the last week. Each displayed explosive power, with Lander hitting a big 388 night (161 single), and Wakeling smashing down 358 pins (142 single) during 1979. These two gents are certain captain material in the future.

Neil Marshall had a banner year rolling 108. He was hardly ever under 100 during any of the early matches and never bowled a week when he did not reach the charmed 300 club. His high was a 371. A good year.

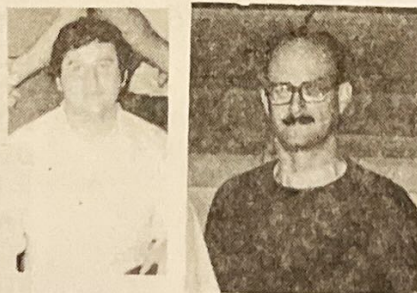
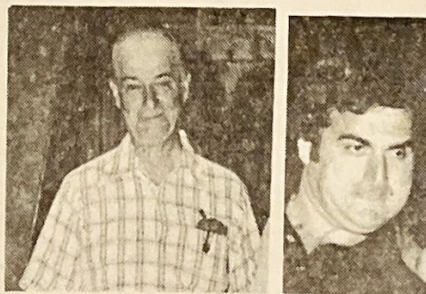
